Retrospective Study afternoon team Klaverblad

Last Tuesday afternoon, we had a study afternoon. The focus was on our citizenship plan. The school's goal is to prepare children as well as possible to actively participate in society. This includes ensuring that children are proficient in arithmetic, reading, and writing, but they also need other skills.

All schools are required to have a good citizenship plan so that they can demonstrate the goals they are working towards and how they are monitoring them. The following learning objectives are included in our citizenship plan:

1. Resilience: The student is resilient and believes in themselves
2. Communication: The student can express themselves, listen to others, and think critically
3. Diversity: The student treats differences and diversity with respect
4. Collaboration: Students can collaborate, take responsibility, and solve problems.
5. Digital skills: Students can use digital resources safely.

6. Participation: Students participate in (democratic) society.

These specific goals have been set by the school. We work on these goals in various ways and at various times, but the citizenship plan provides insight into how we approach them in a targeted manner. We have now reached the stage where we need to work on effective monitoring and evaluation with regard to working on these goals. That was the specific purpose of this afternoon. As a school, we are supported in this by the Kleingroten Denkers organization, which has a great deal of expertise in this area.



We have a great plan that we have a lot of confidence in. One of the key points will be to regularly include updates in the newsletter about how we are working towards one of these goals.
