## MR Review – Results of the Parent Satisfaction Survey

The School Council met again last Wednesday. Among other things, we discussed the satisfaction surveys conducted among parents/guardians and students, as well as the school guide for the coming school year.

We conducted the parent satisfaction survey in January. A total of 122 parents/guardians completed the questionnaire, representing a response rate of approximately 70%.

The results show that parents are very satisfied with our school. The school received an excellent rating of 8.2. We are proud of this, and we greatly appreciate receiving this positive feedback.

## Grade 7's visit to the Oranje Hotel National Monument

*On Friday, May 8, we visited the Oranjehotel National Monument. This used to be a prison during World War II.*

*It was called the Oranjehotel because it mainly held Dutch resistance fighters. Approximately 25,000 people were imprisoned there, and 250 prisoners were sentenced to death and executed by firing squad. Dit gebeurde op de Waalsdorper Vlakte.*

*One of the prisoners was Anton de Kom. He was sent to a concentration camp to perform forced labor and died there from an illness.*

*We heard stories about World War II. We learned about the time the Nazis took over the Netherlands.*

*We went into a cell in pairs and were told about someone who had been imprisoned in the Oranjehotel. There was one cell, 601, that was still in its original condition. This cell was a death row cell.*

*It was in Scheveningen, so we also took a quick trip to the beach.*
